Dear Abbot John,

Father Allen Tarlton attended a workshop here at Saint Luke Institute the week of October 28- November 1, 2002 as part of his continuing care program. The following assessment of his progress in recovery is based on a structured interview held with him on October 29, 2002, four collateral reports received from members of his support network, and his participation in the workshop week.

Recovery Program: This was Father Tarlton's eighth and final workshop week. He continues to experience some compulsive use of the Internet porn sites. As you are aware, Abbot John, the stress and turmoil of recent months have, most likely, worked against his efforts in maintaining sobriety in this area. He has not returned to use of alcohol during this stressful time. This is good news and remains a sign of hope and strength for Father Tarlton.

After he left his last workshop in November 2001, Father Tarlton reported back that he was successful in placing a block on his computer and was feeling better about himself in general. It appears that the painful events surrounding the media exposure concerning Saint John's Abbey in general, and of Father Tarlton, in particular, were unprecedented in your history. This tended to exacerbate some areas of his recovery that were fragile, notably, his tendency to isolate into depression and to use the Internet sites for comfort.

Father Tarlton reports that he attended very few SA meetings over the past six months. He has not met with his support group in a formal way but has interacted

with the individuals in his group mostly in social situations. In their collateral reports, support group members state that they were painfully aware of Father Tarlton's suffering these past six months but did not initiate a group meeting during this time.

Father Tarlton has been updating the individual members of his support team on some details of his situation and has inquired about legal matters. It appears that there has not been a formal meeting in order for all gathered to offer support. Father Tarlton seems ready to initiate such a meeting and we encourage him to get the meeting scheduled as soon as he can.

Father Tarlton reports that he had no meetings with his spiritual director. His director writes that he is concerned that Father's depression comes across as moodiness and this, in turn causes others to withdraw from him. This creates a vicious circle.

In June, Father Tarlton communicated with us here at the Institute to describe his situation in full. He explained that he felt helpless and frustrated and it seemed that his life was on a downward spiral.

He scheduled monthly sessions in psychotherapy over this period. In his collateral report, Father's therapist writes that his greatest achievement has been that of maintaining and deepening some important interpersonal relations. His greatest struggle has been seeking an answer to his question: "What will I do if I don't have access to the Internet and how will I cope with my life and my emotions?"

During our individual interview for this workshop, we tried to delve deeper into this issue. We resolved that Father Tarlton would need to decide upon a series of "replacements" for the type of comfort he sought through using the Internet. We suggest that he take time with his therapist to develop a series of such replacements. We also suggest that he utilize a behavioral approach by gradually lessening the amount of time he spends on the Internet. He acknowledged the fact that he had struggled for years with alcoholism and was able to be free from this addiction. He knows that he has been able to develop the capacity for sobriety in one area and is pleased with this accomplishment.

We are heartened to read in Dr. Vincent's report, that Father Tarlton has been able to deepen some important interpersonal relationships. This will be a key factor in fostering his abstinence from Internet porn. The need to interact with others, despite residual feelings of unworthiness, will be a challenge for Father Tarlton. And yet, he knows, from experience, that he is capable of reaching out and that others appreciate his presence in their lives.

In summary, Father Tarlton's faith has been tested and tried severely over the past year. He used the opportunity provided by this workshop to be honest and open for the support and challenge of his peers. This always produces the same result: a lifting of the burden of isolation and fear and a sense of renewed determination to face into a new day free of the addictive cycle. He knows that he has the capacity to deal effectively with his addiction to alcohol and that he has the capacity to do likewise with Internet addiction.

Current Living Experience/Vocational Functioning: As you are aware, Abbot John, Father Tarlton is currently working in the Oblate office in a less public manner and is able to celebrate Mass weekly in the health facility. He has gone out to movies and dinner on a less frequent basis over the past year.

He shared with us his experience of being affirmed on the occasion of giving a homily at a nearby convent in which he told his story. The response of the sisters present was outstanding as, one by one, they rose in song and prayer for him.

Medical: During the course of the workshop we monitor physical health through the use of various laboratory indices. Father Tarlton regained the weight he had lost last year. His lipid levels are mostly within normal levels except for the HDL-cholesterol, which might benefit from exercise. His HA1C (9.5) suggests higher blood sugars than the unusually low one we got when his blood was drawn. His PSA at 6.58 is a little higher than one year ago. Blood pressure at 150/90 is higher as well. He reports that he does no exercise but is faithful to check-ups with his doctor three times a year.

Recommendations and Treatment Plan: Father Tarlton was very fatigued as he started out the workshop, partly because his flight was late and he arrived at Saint Luke's at midnight. As the week proceeded he became fully engaged in our discussions and was grateful for the interaction and the support he received from staff as well as participants. He left here with a renewed sense of direction and a hope that he could start back into his recovery activities as a priority. He stated the following goal for the near future: to restore his recovery program by returning to meetings, connect with a sponsor, gather his support group, and continue seeing his therapist and spiritual director. His therapist reports that he would like to increase the frequency of their visits. We concur with this opinion and hope that Father Tarlton will share this report with his therapist. Father Tarlton is willing to return to Saint Luke's one year from now and we heartily support this goal.

We wish to thank Father Tarlton for his active participation in this workshop week. We hope that he will take the opportunity to join us one year from now, the week of October 27-31, 2003. A copy of this letter is being forwarded to Father

Tarlton for his reflection. If you have any question regarding this report, please contact us. We encourage Father Tarlton to share this report with his therapist and the members of his support group.

Thank you for your ongoing support of Father Tarlton in his recovery. We ask for your prayers on behalf of the many clergy and religious in our care and promise our prayers for you during this painful time.

First, let me thank you for your participation in the process of risk assessment and safety plan development. Your willingness to share openly with

as well as with your confreres, surely contributed to a deeper understanding of each other and a heightened level of trust in the group.

With this letter, I am formally putting the safety plan developed as a result of that process into place. Canonically, I am required to do this. As we discussed at the meeting on July 26, 2005, Prior Ray Pedrizetti will be the supervisor for the safety plan. He will meet with you once a month to discuss any concerns that you have, and to see how you are doing with the plan. These plans will be reviewed a year from now by Steve and Jannine, as they are meant to be living documents.

I am copying this letter to Father Roman Paur because he is coordinating our accreditation process for the Hope and Healing project with Praesidium Religious Services.

Update on conversations with Father Allen Tarlton

On October 27, 2005 I met with Father Allen Tarlton and told him that I needed to have his hard drive checked for any downloaded pornography files. I told him that would be checking his C:/ and M:/ drives for pornographic files. Allen told me that // had cleaned the C:/ drive off earlier and he thought it was still clean.

I complimented Father Allen on taking the initiative to have his computer linked to computer so that can view any websites that Allen goes to in a two week period. Allen also mentioned that he has been speaking to his therapist regarding the use of pornography. Allen acknowledged that it was a liberation being able to come to my office and not have to confess using pornography.

I asked Allen if he burned any CDs with pornographic material or had any such CDs in his possession. He said no, that he has never used CDs for this purpose.

I also spoke to Allen about a problem with procrastination – specifically, sending information to inquirers into the Oblate program on behalf of He acknowledged the problem, saying that he had gotten behind and simply let the task slip away from his awareness. I told Allen that this was unacceptable – that he had to set up a system such that this was a priority and gets done immediately. Allen understood the seriousness of this. If it occurs again, I will have to take this work away from him because it immediately damages the relationship between a potential oblate candidate and Saint John's Abbey,

from IT Services scanned Allen's C:/ and M:/ drives on October 31, 2005 and found no pomographic material. He said that he did a very thorough search and found nothing.

I asked to another search on Monday, November 14 and to ask Allen at this time where he had stored the material in the past.

Dear Prior Ray:

I am writing this letter to bring you up to date in a formal way regarding Father Allen Tarlton and the problem of internet pomography.

In early November Allen got a new computer and the blocking software program was installed immediately. This software allows the IT person to track which websites Allen is visiting. I have also asked this individual, with Allen's consent, to check Allen's hardrive and other systems on a random basis. I have been clear with Allen that if these steps are ineffective, we will disconnect his computer from the Internet.

I followed up on Steve Sawyer's suggestion and held a joint one-hour meeting with Allen and his therapist on October 19. We discussed the past, current, and future goals of the therapy and also a change in Allen's medication for depression.

On January 19th, Father Allen Tarlton told me that he had requested IT to completely block his access to the Internet. His temptations to access pornography were so strong that he felt he needed to take this step to protect himself and the abbey.

Please put this letter in the file with Allen's safety plan. Thank you.



May I ask whether we are following the Essential Norms, and, if so, how this will be prevented in the future?


Essential Norms for Diocesan/Eparchial Policies Dealing with Allegations of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priests or Deacons

Approved by the Congregation for Bishops, December 8, 2002

When even a single act of sexual abuse by a priest or deacon is admitted or is established after an appropriate process in accord with canon law, the offending priest or deacon will be removed permanently from ecclesiastical ministry, not excluding dismissal from the clerical state, if the case so warrants (CIC, c. 1395 §2; CCEO, c. 1453 §1).4

2. If the penalty of dismissal from the clerical state has not been applied (e.g., for reasons of advanced age or infirmity), the offender ought to lead a life of prayer and penance. He will not be permitted to celebrate Mass publicly or to administer the sacraments. He is to be instructed not to wear clerical garb, or to present himself publicly as a priest.

Dear Allen:

This is a follow-up letter to you, recapitulating our conversation in relationship to your resolutions for Lent, and more specifically in relationship to the review of your Safety Plan.

I said that we really had to follow Steve Sawyer's recommendation that you be off the Internet as of March1, for at least a period of six months. A fundamental step in dealing with an addiction is to admit that one is powerless over the addiction. This means giving up the idea that one can handle it in one's own way. I told AT that if he had continued that approach to alcohol, he would be dead. AT agreed. I also asked you to process how you deal with the emotions that emerge from this situation with your therapist.

I also spoke to you about some of the feelings you shared in your written Safety Plan review and noted the darkness you expressed. When I asked you, you denied being suicidal. When I asked you if you had ever made a plan, you said no. I also said that if you need Word installed on your computer so that it is available on the hard drive, you need to call the Help Desk in IT to make that happen.

I asked you to be consistently present at evening prayer. This is a very rich season of readings and his presence is an essential part of his safety plan. This commitment on your part has to be more than an aspiration.


I asked you further about your depression. Last year you had your medication checked and tuned. I asked you about the practice of sitting on the bed when you get up in the morning and musing on your past life, recapitulating it, especially the way others have treated you. I noted that if I began each day like this, I would return to bed, immobilized. I asked you to get up, walk down the hall for a cup of coffee, scrape the hair off your face, shower and then do lectio before AM prayer. I urged you, despite being 80 years old, to put more energy into looking forward for new things in your life, and not in "unproductive rumination." To replay your life, giving ample opportunity for amplifying each slight, each misunderstanding, is not the pathway into being and living as a forgiven man.

Allen, I really want your life to be better, to be happier, to be more satisfying. I know that there are no easy ways to this kind of internal peacefulness, but I want to assure you that I will be walking with you, to support and encourage you.

I told AT that if he had continued that approach to alcohol, he would be dead. AT agreed. I also asked you to process how you deal with the emotions that emerge from this situation with your therapist.

I also spoke to you about some of the feelings you shared in your written Safety Plan review and noted the darkness you expressed. When I asked you, you denied being suicidal. When I asked you if you had ever made a plan, you said no. I also said that if you need Word installed on your computer so that it is available on the hard drive, you need to call the Help Desk in IT to make that happen.

I asked you to be consistently present at evening prayer. This is a very rich season of readings and his presence is an essential part of his safety plan. This commitment on your part has to be more than an aspiration.

I asked you further about your depression. Last year you had your medication checked and tuned. I asked you about the practice of sitting on the bed when you get up in the morning and musing on your past life, recapitulating it, especially the way others have treated you. I noted that if I began each day like this, I would return to bed, immobilized. I asked you to get up, walk down the hall for a cup of coffee, scrape the hair off your face, shower and then do lectio before AM prayer. I urged you, despite being 80 years old, to put more energy into looking forward for new things in your life, and not in "unproductive rumination." To replay your life, giving ample opportunity for amplifying each slight, each misunderstanding, is not the pathway into being and living as a forgiven man.



On May 2nd I re-configured his workstation to no longer have internet.

Back on February 26th, Allen Tarlton called me and asked to be taken completely off the internet and requested for up to 6 months.

Shortly thereafter, he placed a call to the helpdesk requesting his workstation be reimaged. Unknown to me, his workstation was reimaged on March 24th; removing the blocking software (CyberPatrol) and policies I had in place; and allowing him full access to the internet.

On April 30th, Tom Andert called me informing me that Allen was still getting access to the internet. I went and visited his machine and found that it was reimaged and all of the software was removed.

On May 2nd, I reinstalled the Cyberpatrol software and configured it for no internet access. I also setup a processes to alert me whenever Allen calls the helpdesk with a problem so I am aware of all his calls in case it requires a fix that would remove or change the Cyberpatrol product.

Today, I will pay a visit to his workstation to insure that the product is still installed and all internet activity is being blocked. I will send you a follow-up email later today.

For approximately a year, I have not had access to the Internet. You indicated that I would be restricted until January 2009. However, when I reminded you in June 2009 of your restriction, you indicated the restriction would remain permanently. You insisted that you did not feel you could lift the restriction. You did not allow any discussion of your decision.

I can understand your reluctance to lift the ban, but I would like to be given the chance to prove I can have access to the Internet, at least with restrictions. One of our monks, is under restriction. But he does have limited access to the Internet. He follows a program that allows him to have access to certain websites that are useful to his work or that he finds useful or of interest—vebsites that are not pornographic. Moreover, his computer is monitored by another person, and this person determines which websites can access. I would like to follow this program with the same monitoring system.

Abbot John, I have more interest in the Internet than Just in pornography. There are so many more programs that I want to access. I have been a teacher for many years, and have a strong interest in so many different topics. I have been deprived of the active ministry, access to so many interests that are available to me on the internet are closed to me. I have a strong interest in the intellectual life, in the spiritual life (in spite of appearances to the contrary), in a variety of social issues. I cannot access even websites relating to issues on our own campus.

From my knowledge, the state of the technology is this – you have the same basic 4 choices (nothing new here, we have discussed these options)

- 1 Allen is not allowed any internet access
- 2 Allen is allowed internet access with regular monitoring of his computer
- 3 Allen is allowed internet access with some version of the "blocking/filtering" software you have tried
- 4 Allen has internet access with filter/blocking software and regular monitoring

I am not sure what software you have used but I have assumed your technology folks found the best blocking/filtering software available.

I know that some Corrections departments use software that allows real time monitoring/surveillance, I could get the names of those programs if you would like, but some form of monitoring by another person is still required.

Regarding the question in general, in the end, it seems to me that you have been down this road and you have given Allen ample opportunity to demonstrate his commitment to use the internet according to your guidelines. I might offer another option — allow access with the same filters and monitoring you set up last year and give him a 30 day trial to see if he can manage his behavior. If not, then no software will solve the problem (allowing us to sleep peacefully at night!).

I will check with some folks who know about the most recent software options.







The letter sent prior to your last letter seemed written in anger and with a sense of vindictiveness, especially when you added that in the future I would need to go through access even the Help Desk. Try as I may, I couldn't see the Help Desk as being toxic for me. In frustration and something akin to fury and helplessness, I said, "F----k ItI—I'll get off the Internet permanently, drop out of the Presidium Project, and not be bothered with Abbey superiors, self-help programs, bishops' legislations, and the whole screwed-up mess! It was a no-win situation. And then the Prior called me in for the monthly review session. It was a Kodiatic /grace-filled/epiphanatic moment!

The Prior was relaxed, friendly, humorous, gentle, firm. He made comments that were logical, more or less reasonable, a few ominous. For example, he stated matter-of-factly that neither the Abbot nor Michael Kwatera was going to change their position. He remarked that one monk had threatened to drop from the Presidium Project, but changed his mind when the Abbot said that if he did, he would be invited to leave the community. (I didn't know whether the Prior was yanking my scapular or speaking the gospel. I only know that I wasn't ballsy enough to challenge him.) He confirmed that he was satisfied that I was keeping my safety plan. He spoke very positively to me and made me feel good about myself.



Five years ago we initiated work with Project Pathfinder in Saint Paul for the process of developing Safety Plans. Since then Mr. Steve Sawyer has been the stable, skilled working partner with you, me and the Abbey Review Board. As of January 1, 2010, Steve left the employ of Project Pathfinder and created his own consulting firm, Sawyer Solutions. In consultation with Prior Tom Andert and the review board, I made the decision to transfer our work to Sawyer Solutions, thus maintaining the working relationship with Steve.

One practical implication of this transfer is that we need to have a release signed by you to transfer the documentation from Project Pathfinder to Sawyer Solutions. Second, we need to have a release signed by you to allow the Safety Plans to come from Sawyer Solutions to me and the Abbey Review Board. I include the two releases, which have been reviewed by Mr. Bob Stich, with this letter, as enclosures. If you have any questions about these releases, please give Bob a call and talk it through.

I believe that more regular contact between Steve and each of the men with a Safety Plan would be helpful in making adjustments and creating greater understanding. As a result I have asked Steve Sawyer to be the supervisor, with Prior Tom acting as superior and pastoral presence and meeting with you on a quarterly basis. I think that this will be a fruitful way to approach this work. Steve will be contacting you to schedule a meeting for sometime in April.

In the course of those four days, the abbey team (Mr. Bob Stich, Mr. Mike Ford, Brother Brad Jenniges, Father Jonathan Licari, and me) listened to the stories of twelve survivors. We worked with a mediator in order to arrive at financial settlements, nine of which came to resolution. The others are still in process.

In addition, Mr. Anderson came to the mediation with what he calls "non-economic" demands. A central one of these demands is the publication of the names of monks who have had credible allegations brought against them. As a team we have struggled mightily with this issue and have not come to resolution.

I am asking you to come to a meeting with Mr. Bob Stich on March 11, Friday afternoon, at 1:00 PM in the Abbot Alcuin Conference room. As legal counsel, Bob wishes to meet with you to explain our situation, to answer questions, and to listen to your concerns. At some point, Mr. Mike Ford, Father Jonathan, and I will join you to conclude the meeting, which will end by 3:00 PM. I realize that this is short notice for such a meeting but the need for it became apparent today. Thank you for your assistance in this important matter.

Suit claims St. John's Abbey knew of past abuse

ST. CLOUD, MINN, - A former student sued St. John's Abbey for fraud on Thursday, alleging that the religious order knew one of its members had been accused of sexual abuse as early as 1958 yet let him continue teaching.

The lawsuit was filed in Steams County by a former St. John's Prep student who claims he was sexually abused by the Rev. Allen Tariton in the 1980s.

Tariton was an English teacher at the school.

According to the St. Cloud Times, the lawsuit alleges at least three abbots knew of the allegations against Tarlton but put him teaching roles at St. John's Prep and at other locations in other states and the Bahamas.

A message left with the abbey was not returned to the Associated Press on Thursday.

In 2002, Tariton was among more than a dozen priests in the abbey facing restrictions because of abuse allegations. In depositions for previous lawsuits, Tariton has admitted to prior abuse.

Also in 2002, the abbey removed Tariton from his position as director of the oblate program, which allows lay people to devot themselves to the Benedictine faith without taking vows or living in a religious community.

The lawsuit claims Tarlton was sent to psychiatric treatment and alcohol and sex offender treatment several times between 1980 and 1983.

Jeff Anderson, the attorney representing the plaintiff, known as John Doe LP, said the way the abbey moved Tanton around shows an "adherence to the code of secrecy."

The lawsuit claims the abbey committed fraud by not telling students about Tarlton's history and instead holding out the abbey prep school and university as places where children would be safe from abuse.

Sauk Rapids man sues abbey, school, Benedictine order under new law

A Sauk Rapids man is suing the Order of St. Benedict, St. John's Abbey, St. John's Prep School and a monk who lives at the abbey for sexual abuse he said he suffered in 1977.

The lawsuit filed Wednesday by Troy Bramlage is the direct result of a law passed by the 2013 Legislature that lifted a six-year civil statute of limitations for victims of childhood sexual abuse.

The new law gives victims older than 24 three years to sue for past abuse and anyone younger than 18 an unlimited time to file lawsuits regarding childhood sexual abuse. Previous lawsuits of this nature routinely have been dismissed by district courts as being filed too far after the old statute of limitations had expired.

Bramlage is at least the fifth person to sue the Rev. Allen Tarlton, accusing him of sexual abuse. The other lawsuits either were settled or were dismissed on statute of limitations grounds.

Bramlage said Wednesday that a central motivation for his lawsuit is so others who were afraid to speak about the abuse or unsure their case could be heard in court will know that there is an avenue for them now.

"I want kids to know that if they've been molested by priests, that they can come forward, and they need to get help," he said. "If one person, one kid, comes out and gets help, then this will have been worth it."

The abuse alleged by Bramlage happened when he was 14 and attending the Prep School, he said. It caused him to have great swings in the stability of his life, he said, and still causes him to harbor guilt that not telling someone at the time caused others to be abused later by Tarlton.

Bramlage was joined at a press conference Wednesday in Waite Park by noted clergy sex abuse attorney Jeff Anderson and St. Cloud-area personal injury attorney Michael Bryant.

Anderson reiterated a claim he has made in previous lawsuits against Tarlton, that the abbey knew of his proclivities to offend against young boys as far back at the 1950s and repeatedly allowed him to have access to children, including teaching at St. John's until 1990.

Both Bryant and Anderson stressed that they wanted St. John's Abbey to release an updated list of known offenders so other victims can get the help they need. Anderson said he believes the lists of offenders that the abbey has released in the past are now incomplete.

Tarlton was sent to psychiatric facilities several times for alcohol and sex offender treatment between 1960 and 1983, according to Anderson.

The abbey in April 2002 named Tarlton as one of more than a dozen priests in the abbey who faced restrictions on their movements and work activities because of allegations of sexual abuse against them. In court depositions for previous lawsuits, Tarlton has admitted he sexually abused students.
